## Chairman's Report

What an extraordinary 2005 we have had, full of the highs and lows that characterise following our team. The thrill of winning the Conference, the heady days of topping League 2 in August, the struggle to adapt to life back in the League, our trip to Old Trafford – who could have predicated all that?

More predictably, Barnet Council have continued to frustrate the club's effort to redevelop Underhill. Like others, I hoped that when Brian Salinger replaced Victor Lyon as council leader last summer, the impasse could be broken. Instead, your committee has tried and failed to mediate between him and BFC. However, no progress has been made on Underhill, and the latest fiasco, in which the council has taken out a court injunction stopping BFC upgrading emergency access to the South Stand/Social club area, sums up what is, in my view, their obstructive attitude.

The council have proposed a site in Montrose park, Burnt Oak, but that has restricted access, is already meeting residential opposition and would involve another protracted planning battle. It also lies outside the natural catchment area of our support. To me, it is a red herring, designed to defer discussion of Underhill until after this May's local elections.

These elections have prompted discussion amongst supporters as to whether we should field candidates. My personal view is that we are more likely to influence events by getting the support of the major parties. In 2002, BRASS persuaded the Tories to block South Underhill. In November 2005, the KBA and myself persuaded the Lib Dems to support Working Together 2. They then surprised many by taking a seat from the Tories in December's High Barnet by-election. I hope that will make some Conservatives re-think their opposition to the club. Meanwhile, we should persuade Labour to support Working Together 2 as well. As supporters, we would like to be above politics – sadly, the reality of our ground situation prevents this.

At our delayed AGM, I paid tribute to the work of longstanding members of the BFCSA who have retired from the BFCSA Committee. Since then, we have had an influx of new blood, full of ideas, including the Survey which I urge you to complete and return.

We are all grateful to Steve and Ann for their continued efforts in running coaches to away games. Laying on 19 coaches to Old Trafford was a massive undertaking, smashing our previous record of 6 to the Fisher Athletic promotion game in 1991! It was glorious to see 5,000 Bees fans at Old Trafford, and to have taken 1,000 of them there in conjunction with BFC. My girlfriend and her disabled son enjoyed Man United's superb disabled section – free entry and marvellous facilities – Barnet Council please take note! Sadly, the referee did not share this charity.

The rest of this season looks like time for consolidation. We need to be patient. Hopefully, Paul Fairclough will make the key signings we all know are necessary. Then who knows? The play-offs are the limit, but let's at least consolidate and enjoy ourselves.

## Transport

The Barnet Football Club Supporter's Association runs coach travel to all competitive first team matches on a not for profit basis. Details are available in the match day programme, on the web site of the association ([www.bfcsa.co.uk](http://www.bfcsa.co.uk)) and from the answer phone (01707 647365). Steve and Ann Percy organise this service on behalf of the association. They have nineteen years experience providing the coach service for Barnet supporters. The association is as ever grateful for their continued hard work.

To book for a particular match please phone 01707 647365 and leave your details on the answer machine. Alternately on match days, please book up at number 2 Westcombe Drive (the house next to the Barnet F.C. ticket office) before or after the match. Coaches leave from outside the Queens Arms (next to Barnet Odeon). This season has been a particularly busy one, especially with nineteen coaches being taken to Old Trafford! For the majority of matches there has been enough time to stop off prior to the match at a suitable town/village, which is popular amongst many supporters, as it adds to the day out.

What a day!!! Not only was this a match worth remembering, but the whole day was superb.

The night before, at around 9:30pm I found out I would be travelling to the game in a FREE limo. Carling were laying it on for Pete (Scouse bee) who came back early from his travels in Australia for the game. He invited Craig and myself to join him and a few others in the complimentary limo, you simply do not turn down those sort of offers!

In the morning we had to be at Underhill at 10:30am for the limo and to face the media, however Craig, Chris and I were hanging around until just gone 11am and had been starting to worry that it could all be a wind-up, luckily it wasn't and Pete and the other lads arrived in the limo on Westcombe Drive. Then came all the media attention.

We were interviewed by Sky Sports News and were all filmed in the limo by ITV London and we definitely got on the lunch and evening news, though we weren't interviewed in that one. We also got a few pictures with the Carling Cup. We had it in the limo for a little while too, where we were allowed to hold it as no one else could see, the public were not supposed to touch it.

We set off on the journey to Old Trafford after a few more pictures for the press and also for ourselves and left from by Pete's house at 12:15pm. With plenty of time we decided to take a quick and simple de-tour, past all the people waiting by the Queens for the coaches! They were in the limo, each with a complimentary glass of champagne and there were they, waiting for their coaches! The jealousy from them was hilarious, which I increased by smiling out the window with the champers glass visible! Though it was all friendly banter.

The limo in general was a good laugh, some very funny jokes and stories were told, everyone seemed to get on well and it was a good crack. Waving out the window to random people was something we found pretty amusing as no one could see who we were with the tinted windows, we really made one little lad in another car's day! The free cans of Carling went down fine, but this was a game I wanted to remember and sobriety was a personal priority!

It was a long journey up however. Traffic was quite bad and along with a few stops, (one where we saw some Barnet fans who recognised us off the TV) apart from a quick stop once we finally got to the other side of the Midlands, we carried on until Manchester, getting there at about 6:15pm.

When we got to Old Trafford, we took a few pictures of the outside and had a little wander about. Saw a lot of Barnet fans I know, which was good, as me and Craig were waiting for James, who had my ticket. I got my programme and a few more pictures, had a look around the Man U mega store and then went into the ground a little after 7pm. Surreal feeling. A tremendous stadium. Slowly but surely it began filling up (though not to full capacity) and it looked amazing seeing all those people in the Barnet section, lets hope some come back again.

My feelings in the first half of the game were mainly of disappointment. I was so upset for both Ross Flitney and Louie Soares, the referee should have used a bit of his initiative and not ruined what would've been a memorable night for two young men. Flitney was silly, but wasn't trying to cheat and a red card was a joke. I really felt for the two lads. That incident did more or less ruin the first half.

The second half however was quality. We played excellently and no way did we deserve to lose 4-1. At times we matched Man United easily and to some extent in the last fifteen minutes I thought we were the better team. Deano's goal...what a celebration in the stand, was awesome, we went totally mental and rightly so!

At the end of the game I felt nothing but proud. Those players deserved their long standing ovation totally and I'd like to credit and thank the number of Man United fans who clapped our lads off too, very good of them. I really thought we were special at times in the second half. Mates who'd made the trip up but were scattered all around the upper tier of the stand received a very brief text message. "Proud."

I left the ground not feeling down at all and was fairly happy when we got back in the limo. A few cans of Carling were cracked open and we watched a few DVD's on the long haul back to North London. At around midnight we stopped at a service station and a few of us had a full English Breakfast, at midnight!

By the time we said our goodbyes and were back by the Queens in Barnet it was about 3am. I was knackered, but had thoroughly enjoyed my day. Despite the result, I felt very proud to be a Barnet fan as I think the players gave it their all. I'm sure the 4499 other Bees supporters as well as I, will remember that day for the rest of their lives. Man United away, we literally lived the dream!

It has been an eventful few months, but we are now entering the most vital period, the run up to the May Local elections, where we all have a chance to make a difference for the future of our football club. Barnet Council has offered the club a site for a new stadium at Montrose Park. However, it is far too early to say how realistic this offer is, as the site is on a flood plain, and requires more feasibility studies, which the club would be expected to pay for, without any guarantee of success. There is also the small matter of local residents, who have yet to be afforded the luxury of the consultations granted to BRASS by this council! Even if it were to go ahead, any such move would be some years off, and the more pressing concerns are with the immediate future, and getting the minimum FL requirements and safety issues at Underhill resolved, or face the threat of FL expulsion!

Many of these issues are addressed within the Working Together document. However, the current administration seem far more content to dodge this safety issue, and play party politics over the matter, as can be seen with their recent court injunction to stop safety work at Underhill going ahead. This work dealt with access and egress to the south of Underhill, an issue highlighted by the fire under the South Stand after the Arsenal match in July, but these improvements have been dismissed by the council as merely "car parking"! Given the amount of much public money wasted in their witch-hunt against us since 2002, it begs the question, what price health and safety?

We are making an impact with the public! Our volunteers leafletted local residents during the High Barnet by-election in December, where the LibDems, the only party to back BFC's revised Working Together document, gained a spectacular victory on a swing of over 20% from the Tories. This shows that Barnet FC, and a fair solution to our ground worries, is an issue voters care about, and shows what we can achieve! However, we will need more volunteers over the coming months. If you're a Barnet resident aged 18 or over, please make sure that you are registered to vote, by completing the form enclosed with this newsletter. If you have any time to spare, please contact the KBA or BFCSA to offer your services, whether you can do leafletting, letter-writing, or attend a local meeting!

# Registering to Vote

You can only vote in elections if your name is on the Register of Electors. We update the register every autumn, but we also add names throughout the year.

## ***Moved Home? Coming up to 18? Or just not on the Register!***

All you have to do is fill in the registration form overleaf. If you need a large print version, we can provide this on request.

When you send us your form, we will add you to our list of new applications. Any elector can then object to your name being added to the register. If this happens, we will write to you.

If your application is not objected to, we will add / change your details within 7 weeks of receiving your form. We will write to you to tell you your application is allowed.

There is no monthly update during September, October or November during the annual canvass period when all households have to register. A new Register is published on 1st December.	

*\*\* Monday 13th March is the last date that applications may be made for the Thursday 4th May election.*

We will also tell the Electoral Registration Officer for your old address that you have moved, so that your name can be removed from that register. People who live at two homes (including students) are allowed to register at both. If you do not want to be removed from your other address, please explain why on your form.

There are special rules about names being added to the register during an election period. Because of these, you may not be able to vote at that election if you are added during this time.

## The Two Versions of the Register

The Electoral Registration Officer makes and keeps two versions of the Electoral Register - the Full Register and the Edited Register.

**The Full Register** lists everyone who is registered to vote. You can check it by calling in to the Electoral Services and some local libraries. Only certain people and organisations can have copies of the Full Register, and they can only use it for specified purposes. These include electoral purposes, the prevention and detection of crime and checking your identity when you have applied for credit. The law says who can have a copy of the Full Register and what they can use it for. The full list of such persons and purposes is given in the Representation of the People (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2002. It is a criminal offence for them to pass it on to anyone else or to use it for any other purpose.

**The Edited Register** leaves out the names and addresses of people who have asked for them to be excluded from that version of the register. The Edited Register can be bought by anyone who asks for a copy and they may use it for any purpose.
